Стартовая диагностика по английскому языку 10 класс

Варианты предназначены для того, чтобы дать представление о структуре будущих контрольных измерительных материалов внутренней системы оценки качества образования по английскому языку для 10 класса, количестве заданий, об их форме и уровне сложности.

Мониторинг предметных результатов проводится в соответствии с «Положением о внутренней системе оценки качества образования в МБОУ СОШ № 5 с. Иглино, «Положением о формах, периодичности, порядке текущего контроля успеваемости и промежуточной аттестации обучающихся в МБОУ СОШ № 5 с. Иглино.

1. Назначение диагностической работы

Работа предназначена для проведения процедуры текущей диагностики индивидуальной общеобразовательной подготовки обучающихся по предмету английский язык в 10 классе на начало учебного года, а также факторов, влияющих на результаты их дальнейшего обучения. Тексты заданий предлагаемой модели контрольной работы в целом соответствуют Федеральному компоненту государственного стандарта общего образования (ч.2 среднее (полное) общее образование), формулировкам, принятым в учебниках и учебных пособиях, включенным в Федеральный перечень. Вид работы: Контрольный тест.
